BUSINESS MEETING

When: Wednesday, May 11, 2022, 6:30-8:00 p.m.

Title: Insights into Interventions for Breast Cancer-Related Lymphedema: Applying the CPG, CPG+

Speaker: Michele Moravec PT, DPT, Board Certified Clinical Specialist in Oncologic Physical Therapy, Certified Lymphedema Therapist

Course Description: Lymphedema is a debilitating chronic condition of limb swelling that is, unfortunately, a possible effect of breast cancer and its related treatment. However, evolving evidence demonstrates less incidence and severity of breast cancer-related lymphedema with intervention. This intervention is based on a patient's clinical presentation at any point along the cancer treatment timeline. This course will describe evidence-based treatment interventions for breast cancer-related lymphedema utilizing the Interventions for Breast Cancer-Related Lymphedema: Clinical Practice Guideline from the Academy of Oncologic Physical Therapy of APTA. Furthermore, this course will describe its CPG+ and highlight the positive impact of using these tools to guide clinical decision-making for appropriate interventions across the patient care continuum.

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT (ICYMI)

The Southeast District would like to acknowledge Janet L. Readinger, PT, DPT, Assistant Professor of Physical Therapy, Arcadia University for her contribution to the accepted manuscript Physical Therapist Management of Parkinson Disease: A Clinical Practice Guideline from the American Physical Therapy Association. Several SED members represented our district in educational sessions and research presentations at the 2022 APTA Combined Sections Meeting (CSM) in San Antonio, Texas in February. Stephanie Muth taught an educational session on the topic of aging with a degenerative neurologic disease. Bryan Spinelli had a platform presentation on his research investigating functional shoulder workspace before and after breast cancer surgery. Lisa Hoglund had a poster presentation about her research which found altered hip and knee kinematics during a single leg squat task of men with patellofemoral pain compared to the kinematics of pain-free men.

MARCH

On Wednesday, March 30, the Minority Affairs Committee hosted its annual Virtual Game Night. There were 10 participants in attendance (including both PT/PTA professionals and students). On April 27, the MAC hosted the "Be the Change you Want to See - ADAPT Follow Up Seminar." In the fall of 2021, APTA PA awarded the very first "ADAPT" scholarships to four schools in Pennsylvania, totaling up to \$30,000. This monetary award was provided to PT or PTA education programs to support the development of programs that aim to increase recruitment and enrollment of students from under-represented racial and ethnic minority groups (URMG).

We had over 45 attendees, including leaders from across other APTA state chapters! Thanks to all those who helped produce such exciting content for us all.
