Dedicated to increasing the diversity of the students in your program? The American Physical Therapy Association of Pennsylvania is here to help. Come learn about our "ADaPT Grant," inspired by the ADaPT program created by Dr. Gregory Hicks at the University of Delaware. This grant will provide a one-time monetary award of up to \$10,000 to PT or PTA education programs to support the development of sustainable programs that aim to increase recruitment and enrollment of students from under-represented racial and ethnic minority groups. Grant recipients will be required to provide regular progress, accounting reports and outcomes assessment data.
